The continued Operating and Succession Plan for 2020 has several steps to it:

- The first step in the plan is to update and finalize Board Policies.
- The second step is to continue to place equipment in Fire House #3 on Hwy KK (known as the Lixville Fire House). Currently we have a Mack pumper/tanker and are looking to add a brush truck.
- The third step in the plan is to purchase new fire gear and/or equipments (AS NEEDED) to continue to build to what we have and need for services.
- The fourth step is to move forward on a decision regarding #2 in Mayfield Hollow.

We have nine firefighters and are still searching for more. There are multiple roles that volunteers play in our organization.

I have been a resident and tax payer of the Sedgewickville Fire Protection District (SFPD) since 1999. Some of you may know and remember me with my service to the Department during the years of 2000-2012. As we head into this new decade, 2020, we embrace what we've already accomplished. The accomplishments made in 2019 could not have been done without the help of our neighbor Biehle Community Fire Protection Association, the SFPD Firefighters, the SFPD Board of Directors and various community residents.

Since taking over as Chief, we have been able to get SFPD operating without any additional service agreements. The SFPD currently has two pumpers/engines, one tanker, and one brush truck. The SFPD has nine firefighters that have spent much of 2019 obtaining the necessary Missouri State training needed to safely and effectively provide firefighting and rescue operations for their residents. The Firefighters and I have continued our education through trainings this first quarter and have several upcoming trainings already on the calendar. The plan also includes increasing the staffing with volunteers.
