FROM THE DESK OF THE BOARD AND OPERATIONS:

"THE END OF ANOTHER GREAT YEAR...THE BEGINNING OF A BETTER ONE"

The Sedgewickville Fire Protection District (SFPD) Board and Operations uses this motto every year. 2019 – current, what a busy and blessed 5 years it has been.

April of 2019, we held our Open House and debuted the 1993 E-One Pumper (Engine) the district purchased. Since then and as of current day, we have a 1992 E-One Pumper, a 2005 Suburban Medical Response Unit, a 2005 Tanker (from the Conservation program), a 2003 Chevy Brush truck, A 2003 GMC Brush truck and a 1975 Tanker (donation from Zell Fire Department). Current Active Firehouses are FULL!!

Our Volunteers remain level at 5-15 on the roster. We launched a Junior Firefighter Program October of 2023 with currently 5 Juniors on the department. Our Volunteers meet twice a month (Wednesday nights), a Saturday every other month, the 5th Wednesday of the month and attend external trainings. These meetings and time spent in and away from the firehouse keep our Volunteers and Equipment ready to Serve the District.

What type of Call Volume do we support:

- April 17 2019 to year end = 39 calls
- 2020 = 72 calls
- 2021 = 111 calls
- 2022 = 123 calls
- 2023 = 110 calls

Medical First Responder calls average 55% of our call volume. The remaining calls fall into categories such as Motor Vehicle Accidents, Fire (Structure and Wildland (Brush)), Search and Rescue/Other. What is Other you may ask... that can be tree removal from road, traffic control due to cows on the road, a combination of miscellaneous items that we may be asked to help or respond to.

Our average response time is at 14 mins. For a volunteer department with responding from Home to Station to Scene, we are proud of that average; however, that does not keep us from working on making it better each year. As many know, our Volunteers hold full time jobs as well. This at times does leave availability to the minimum or could cause no availability. Over the years we have had some instances where we were not able to respond to the call. We work on plans and coordinate who is in and out of district to help minimize that risk, when we can. The plan is working, or maybe it was by God's grace, because in 2023 we responded to all 110 calls.

What else has occurred over the last 5 years....Board increased from 3 to 5 members, Launching of a Facebook Page (https://www.facebook.com/SedgewickvilleFD), Launching of a Website (https://www.sedgewickvillefd.org/), clean up and painting of Firehouse 1 in Sedgewickville, Equipment and Gear updates with Grant awards, No Injuries or Department Incidents while responding to calls, andso on ...and...too much to list.

How is all this accomplished?

- By a great TEAM for the department
- Support of the family members for the time away from them
- Support from YOU, the District members.

Future goals are to maintain what we have, continue to grow and provide service for the needs of the District.

IN OTHER NEWS:

In 2023 a Fundraising Committee provided additional support to the District on financial needs. The fundraiser was a Bake Sale held at Circle U Bar and Grill.

The District's income is tax based on Real Estate and Personal Property Tax with an estimated yearly income around \$52,000.00 +/-. Approximately 1/3 of the income is already dedicated to Insurance. The rest of the income is then spread over normal bills like fuel, maintenance of equipment, building utilities and maintenance, Personal Protection Equipment (gear), replacement of Medical Supplies, Hand Tools/Equipment and Grant Money Match Dollars.
